Clear cutting the forest leads to a host of problems:

- ▶ Destruction of the softwood forest.
- ▶ The erosion of soil after logging.
- ▶ The natural habitat of the wildlife is destroyed.
- ▶ The traditional hunting, fishing and gathering is severed.
- ▶ The traditional medicines that grow in the forest are destroyed.
- ▶ The traditions of Aboriginal people are almost forgotten.

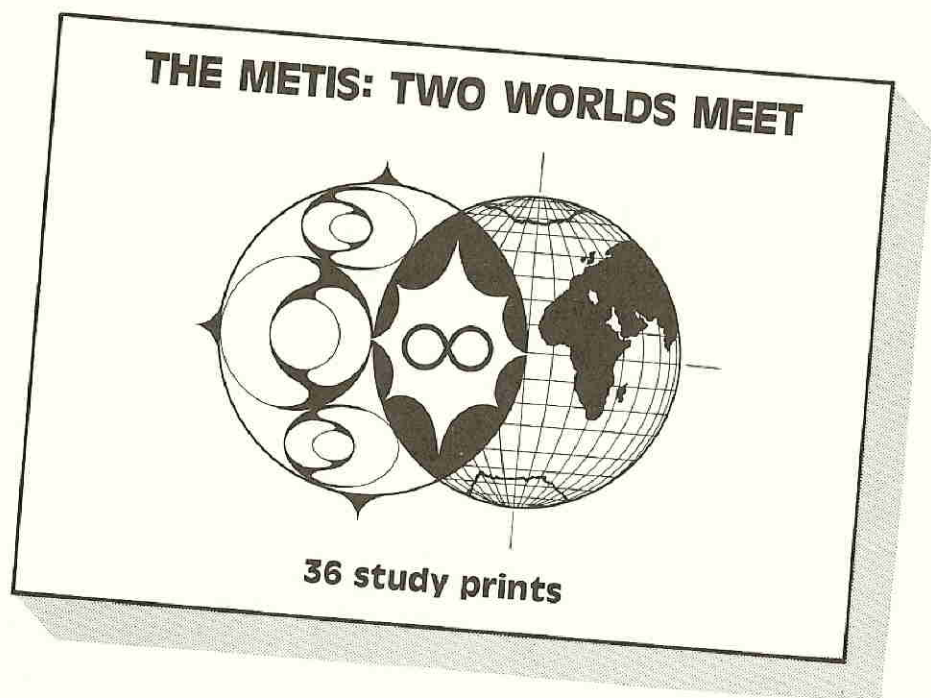

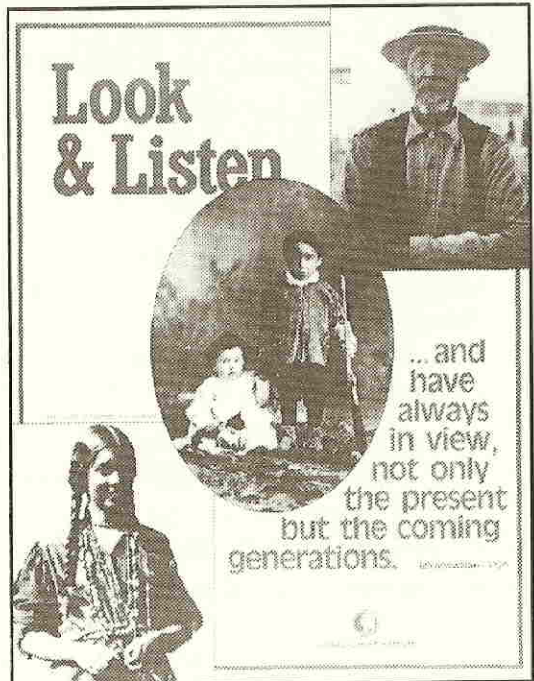
POSTER: OUR CHILDREN—OUR FUTURE

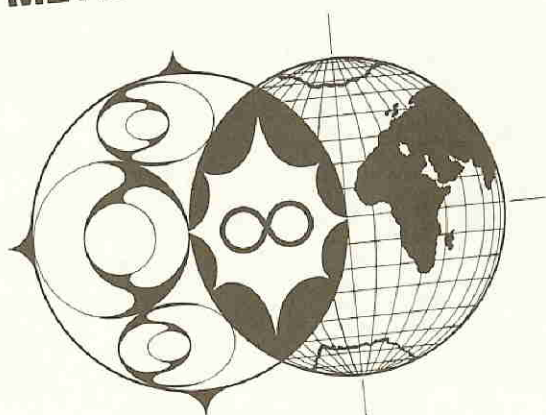
POSTER: LOOK AND LISTEN

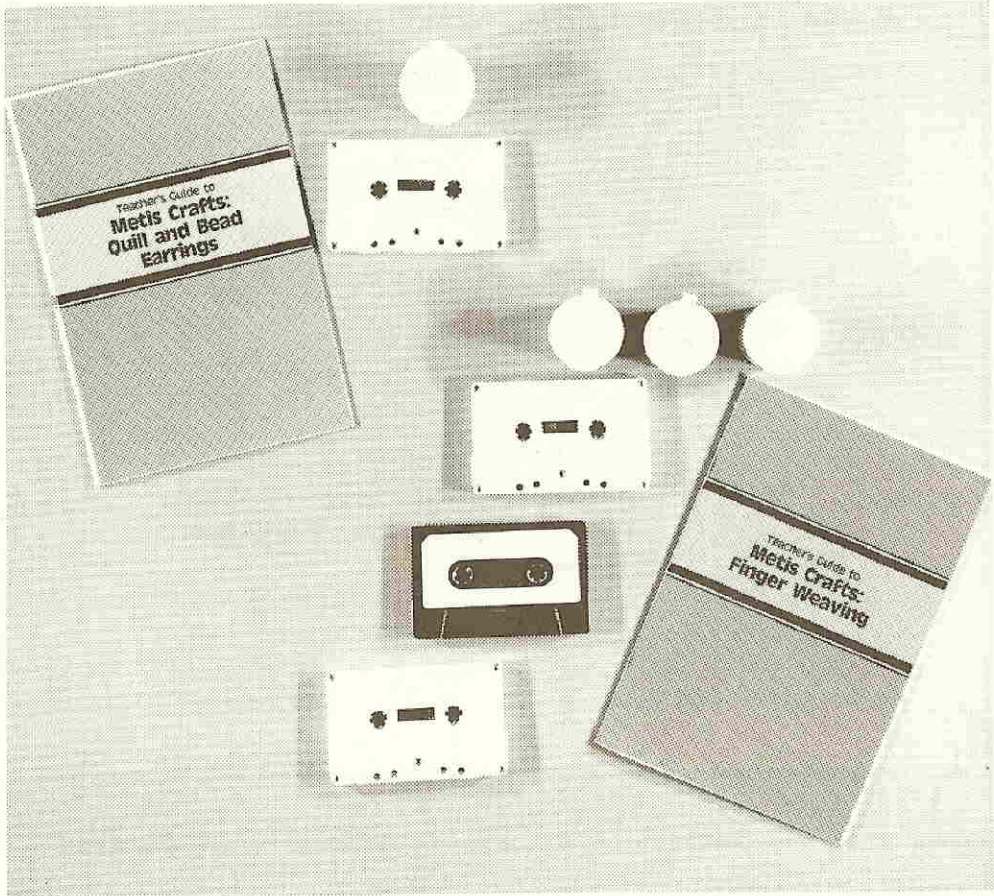
