## Joseph « Savage » Montreuille. (b. 1824)

Joseph was born in 1823 the son of Joseph Montreuille Sr. (b. 1808) and Isabelle Mi-jigi-si, the daughter of Pe-wah-ah-kum (O-kit-chi-ta) and Margaret Ah-dick Songab. This family appears as household # 79 in the Pembina census of 1850. Joseph senior is listed as a hunter.<sup>1</sup> Joseph Jr. married Marguerite Descoteaux, the daughter of Pierre Descoteaux and Josephte Belgarde on November 19, 1855 at Pembina. They had five children. Their oldest daughter Julia (b. 1859) married John Brunelle and was a wellknown mid-wife and Medicine Woman at Turtle Mountain.

Joseph "Savage" Montreuille signed the Pembina and Red Lake Chippewa "Old Crossing Treaty' in 1863 as a warrior with Miscomuhquoh (Red Bear), a chief of the Pembina Chippewa Band. He was a well-known mail carrier on the Crow Wing Trail.
