Metis Beaded Vests

Metis vests were made out of moose, elk and deer-hide; or from stroud cloth, velvet and nowadays from Melton cloth. The edging was usually made from silk ribbon, nowadays edging is done with bias tape or braid. Metis beaded vests and beaded buckskin jackets became a status symbol in the old north-west among army officers and scouts.










