Rolande Gingras

Baseball player Rolande Gingras was the daughter of Stanley cup winner Tony Gingras and great-granddaughter of Metis trader and founder of St. Joseph, North Dakota, Antoine Gingras.

Rolande Gingras, the daughter of the hockey player "Tony" Gingras, was the only Métisse on the St. Boniface Athletic Association women's baseball team in 1939.

Her father, Tony B. Gingras, who played right wing, was a top scorer for the Winnipeg Victorias. In 1901, the Vics won the Stanley Cup and the national championship against the Montreal Shamrocks in a best of three series. He was also with the Victorias when they won the Cup in 1902 by defeating the Toronto Wellingtons.
