As was introduced at the PMC meeting on June 17th in Saskatoon, this is the first bi-weekly mail out from the Bilateral desk of the Intergovernmental Affairs Unit to update you on what is happening with the Saskatchewan Government. As the MN-S moves forward and tries to build a stronger relationship with the province, it is important that you be kept apprised of major policy decisions and activities that affect Métis citizens across Saskatchewan and in your area.
