# Provenance of Madeleine Wilkie/Gabriel Dumont Photograph Edmond J. Mallet Collection, Emmanuel d'Alzon Library, Assumption College



Madeleine Wilkie Dumont and Gabriel Dumont, Red River Settlement, Manitoba, 1860s
Gabriel Dumont and Madeleine Wilkie were married 7 September 1857
in St. Joseph (now Walhalla), Pembina County, Dakota Territory (now North Dakota)

These dual photographs, mounted on a single cabinet card (6 ½" x 4"), were presented by Gabriel Dumont to Major Edmond J. Mallet in a letter dated 31 October 1887.

In October 1876, Major Mallet began a one-year tour of duty as an Indian Agent at Tulalip Agency in Washington Territory. Mallet returned to Washington, D.C. to again work for the Treasury Department from approximately 1880 to 1887. In the summer of 1888, Major Mallet was appointed by President Grover Cleveland to be Indian Inspector and Special Disbursing Agent. As Inspector, Major Mallet visited and reported on conditions at one dozen Indian Agencies and Schools. The majority of the photographs in his collection were taken at the Agencies and Schools. After one year as Indian Inspector, Mallet was appointed Chief of the Bureau of Swamplands.

According to a memoir of Mallet in the "Catalogue de la Bibliothèque de L'Union Saint-Jean-Baptiste D'Amérique," during the forty years that Major Mallet was in Washington, D.C., he devoted himself constantly to promoting the multi-faceted interests of his fellow French Canadians in the United States and Canada. Major Mallet worked for the U.S. Government until his death in 1907.

Edmond J. Mallet's manuscript and photograph collection was purchased by the Union Saint-Jean-Baptiste d'Amérique (now Catholic Financial Life Insurance) in 1917 along with Mallet's personal library. Catholic Financial Life (CFLI) gifted Mallet's papers to the Emmanuel d'Alzon Library, Assumption College, Worcester, Massachusetts, in December 2012.

The dual photograph cabinet card of Madeleine Wilkie and Gabriel Dumont now resides among the papers and photographs of the Edmond J. Mallet Collection, Emmanuel d'Alzon Library.

Also among the Mallet Collection is a three-page letter from Gabriel Dumont to Major Edmond J. Mallet which confirms Dumont's presentation of the photographs to Major Mallet. Excerpt:

Stapleton Staten Island, N. Y., 31<sup>st</sup> Oct<sup>he</sup> 1887

Cher Monsieur,



The name of the studio in which the photographs of Madeleine Wilkie and Gabriel Dumont were taken was not indicated on the front or back of the photos. There do exist, however, photographs of other people taken in the same studio with the same furniture, drapes, tassels, and floor pattern. Some of these photos have the photographer's stamp on the back.
















The photographer was Ryd

The photographer was Ryder Larsen, a Norwegian who came to Rupert's Land, British North America, as a carpenter for the Hudson's Bay Company, eventually settling in St. Andrew's Parish in the Red River Settlement. Larsen set up photography studios in both Winnipeg and St. Andrew's that operated from around 1866 to 1869. In December 1869, deeply in debt and having alcohol problems, Larsen was involved in a brawl among men "carousing at the house of Peter Pruden" [his father-in-law] in St. Andrew's on Christmas Eve that resulted in him being charged with the murder of Thomas Johnstone. Larsen never came to trial. In late 1871 he left the Red River Settlement, abandoning his wife and child, and was never seen again.



The photographs of Madeleine Wilkie and Gabriel Dumont were taken in the Red River Settlement at a studio operated by Ryder Larsen, either in Winnipeg or in St. Andrew's.

### Date of the Photograph


With regard to dating the photograph, Dumont stated in his letter that he was 23 years old when the photograph was taken. As Dumont was born in December 1837, he would have been 23 years old for most of 1861. The photograph could therefore be dated *circa* 1861. Ryder Larsen the photographer, however, was said to operate his studio *circa* 1866 to 1869. Combining that information, the best the photograph can be dated is the 1860s.











While the letter from Gabriel Dumont gifting the photographs to Edmond Mallet does, in itself, confirm the identities of the two people in the photographs, further investigation was undertaken by Elizabeth Maisey, Head of Technical Services and Special Collections at Emmanuel d'Alzon Library, Assumption College, Worcester, Massachusetts; Darren Préfontaine and the staff at Gabriel Dumont Institute in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan; and Lyle Brennen, private researcher.

Using face recognition software, the face landmarks on two known photographs of Gabriel Dumont at left and right were compared to the face landmarks on the photograph at center.























Seven known photographs of Dumont were visually compared to the photograph at far right.

Having established that the man in the dual photographs is Gabriel Dumont, it is reasonable to conclude that the woman is his wife, Madeleine Wilkie. The photographs were obviously taken at the same location and very likely at the same time. The original photograph is a single cabinet card with the dual images imprinted on it. There would be little reason for Gabriel Dumont to print and distribute cabinet cards showing him with any woman other than his wife Madeleine. They were married in St. Joseph (now Walhalla), Dakota Territory (now North Dakota) on 7 September 1857. The two appear to be close in age. By Gabriel Dumont's own words, these photographs were taken when he was 23 years old and Madeleine was 25.

In past years, it was claimed by some that the woman in the photograph was Julie Lagimodière Riel, the mother of Louis Riel. The provenance presented on previous pages does, in itself, exclude this possibility. A close examination of high resolution images of the Wilkie/Dumont photographs reveals that both the man and the woman have Métis facial features. Madeleine Wilkie was Métisse. Julie Lagimodière Riel was not Métisse, she was French Canadian. Julie Riel was born in 1822 and Gabriel Dumont in 1837. There does not appear to be a 15-year age difference between the two people in the photographs. The evidence does not support this being a photograph of Julie Lagimodière Riel.

While clearly two different women, both photographs were taken in the studio of Ryder Larsen.
