## Lagamodière (Lafleur), Josette. (b.c. 1851)

Josette was the daughter of Joseph Lagamodière (b. 1825)<sup>1</sup> and Josephte Lussier<sup>2</sup>. Josette accompanied Sister Sarah Riel to Ile--la Crosse on June 19, 1871. Josette and Sarah were cousins. In 1871, Josette signed a four-year contract with the sisters of Charity to serve as one of two *filles-engagées* to work at the mission at Ile-a-la-Crosse. On June 15, 1875, Josette married Charles Lafleur in a service performed by Bishop Grandin. Charles (b. June 10, 1847) was the son of Charles Lafleur and Marie Nikawe. He was a HBC employee who worked as a trapper for 25 years then retired with a small pension.
