She was a Harrington Fellow at the Centre for Rupert's Land Studies in 2000-01. In 2004, she was a recipient of a Canada Council for the Arts grant for Aboriginal Writers and Storytellers. She was also a 2007/08 recipient of Canada Council for the Arts grant for Aboriginal and Storytellers and a similar grant in 2010. In 2008, she founded White Buffalo Books.
